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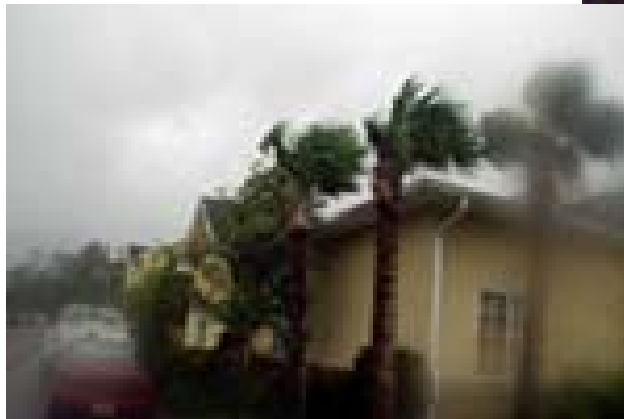
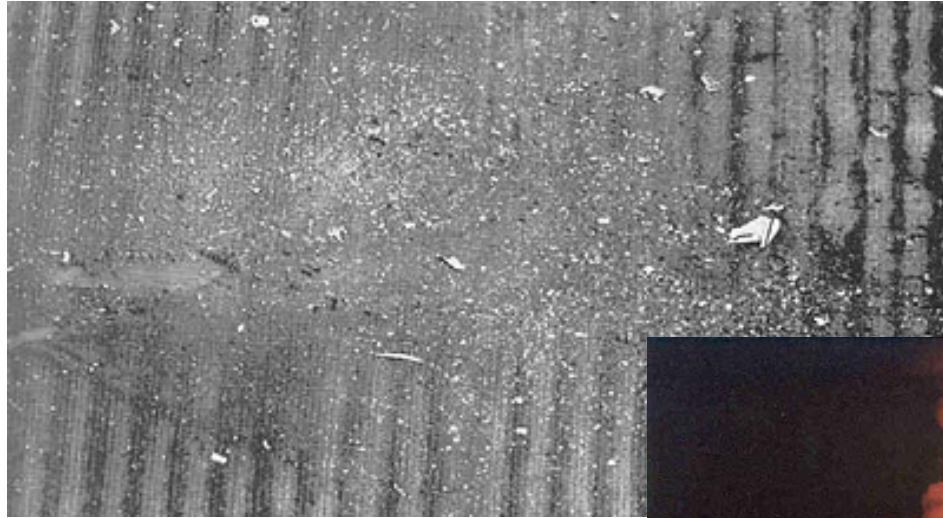

Codes & Standards:

- **Why?**
 - **Create measurable/ standardized outcomes**
 - Quantify skill sets
 - Define resource types
 - **Establish Ground Rules**
 - **Create COMMON, INTEROPERABLE framework**

Codes & Standards

- National Fire Protection Association (NFPA)
 - 1006: Technical Rescuer Prof. Qualifications
 - 1670: Technical Rescue Ops & Training
 - 1600: Disaster & emergency Management
 - 1561: Incident Management
 - **ALL adopted by UK and other countries**
- ICMA / Others

Resource Management:

- **KEY to successful outcomes**



Resource Management:

- Why?
 - Track available versus used
 - Adequate "inventory"
 - Forecast Event needs
 - Support Tactical objectives

Resource Management:

- When?
 - Pre-incident planning
 - Exercises
 - Event Operational phase
 - Post Incident Analysis

Resource Management:

- How?
 - Part of the IMS System
 - ALWAYS staffed
 - maintaining **ACCURATE & DYNAMIC** Data
 - Paper based
 - PC Based
 - Smart Systems & Other technologies?
 - How do YOU do it?

Resource types:

- Why?
 - Common Terminology
 - Ask for Apples and get Apples
 - Interoperability
 - Your resources may come from **ANYWHERE**

Resource Typing:

- **What are resources?**
